



Impacts of the Expansion of Fort Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport***

Dear Town Council,

The firm of Stearns Weaver Miller Weissler Alhadeff & Sitterson, P.A. (“Stearns Weaver Miller”) is pleased to present this proposal for services related to the proposed expansion of the Fort Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport (“Airport” or “Airport Expansion”).

The proposal is divided into three distinct phases because we understand that the Town must balance its financial investment with the achievement of specific objectives. Therefore, each phase is intended to focus the Town’s resources to maximize its ability to impact the FAA’s and Broward County’s decision making process with respect to the Airport Expansion; while at the same time laying the foundation for future legal action against one or both should the Town determine that such action is necessary. Furthermore, the Town is provided with the opportunity, at specific points in time, to review, consider and determine whether or not it desires to continue to oppose the Airport Expansion.

Background: On behalf of the Town, Stearns Weaver Miller, with the assistance of The Four Gates Company and Charles Salter Associates, prepared comments to the FAA’s Draft Environmental Impact Statement (“DEIS”). This DEIS was prepared by the FAA in support of the proposed expansion of the Ft. Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport (“Airport”). In addition, we appeared before the Broward County Commission to voice the Town’s opposition to the DEIS and the corresponding Airport expansion. Notwithstanding our efforts, and the efforts of others, the Broward County Commission elected to proceed with proposed Airport expansion (alternative B1c of the DEIS). This alternative provides for the lengthening of

Runway 9R/27L ("South Runway") to 8,000 feet and elevating it over the Florida East Coast Railway line and U.S. 1. This expansion of the South Runway is the most costly of the alternatives (excluding the "no action" alternative preferred by the Town), and will have the greatest negative impact upon nearby residents and the environment.

Based upon our prior work on behalf of the Town we understand the most important issue in regard to the Airport Expansion is the negative impacts (particularly noise impacts) it will have on the quality of life of the Town's residents and businesses. We believe these impacts, along with the issue of wetlands and noise mitigation, are the areas most vulnerable to potential legal challenge. In order to address these specific areas, our firm will be assisted by experts in airport operations, noise, land use and environmental justice, wetlands/ecology, and air quality. Our core team of The Four Gates Company and Charles Salter Associates will remain in place, with supplemental assistance from two new experts (Terramar Environmental Services, Inc. and RECON Environmental, Inc.) chosen for their experience in specific areas we believe are particularly weak in the DEIS documentation ("Team").

Scope of Work: Stearns Weaver Miller, with the assistance of the Team, is prepared to continue to represent the Town in its efforts to ensure that the FAA prepares a legally compliant Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") that properly documents the negative impacts and true cost of the proposed Airport Expansion; as well as opposing the expansion itself in accordance with the following proposal:¹

Part 1

Time Frame: Present day up to issuance of the FEIS by the FAA.

Objective: Focus on key areas of the proposed Airport Expansion, including noise and air quality impacts, as well as mitigation assessment and mitigation costs. In addition, specific ecological impacts will be further reviewed. This phase of work will provide a strong technical basis for future comments as well as put an estimated cost to mitigate the noise impacts in the Town – an achievement which we believe creates a powerful tool for discussion of the project with those County Commissioners that support the Airport Expansion.

Scope of Services: Substantive review analysis of the Part 150 noise study currently being prepared by Broward County and file comments and objections as appropriate; further analysis of DEIS, including models/technical analysis by expert consultants; review of the cumulative environmental impacts of other projects at the Airport, or associated with the Airport expansion (e.g., impact of new Airport terminal(s), Port Everglades expansion, etc.) on air quality, children, affordable housing, minorities, water quality, endangered species, etc.); requests for documents from government agencies (including Freedom of Information Act requests); and general

monitoring of process from an environmental, procedural (FAA compliance with its own regulations), and legal perspective.

*Cost:*² Stearns Weaver Miller – \$32,500.00 (130 hours at \$250 an hour).

Part 2

Time Frame: Issuance of FEIS up to issuance of Record of Decision by the FAA (“ROD”).

Objective: Establish a record of comments for those areas not adequately addressed by the FEIS. This is a critical comment period for establishing standing for future actions, and for determining if other actions or interventions are warranted. For example, if project mitigation is not properly defined in the FEIS it could have serious negative future impacts on the Town.

Scope of Services: Substantive review and analysis of the FEIS, including identification of legal and procedural deficiencies; technical review/analysis of final models used by FAA; monitor FAA actions with respect to the ROD, continue to review materials from FAA and other agencies related to the Airport expansion; and general coordination/monitoring of consultants.

Cost: Stearns Weaver Miller - \$35,000.00 (140 hours at \$250 an hour).
The Four Gates Company - \$11,840.00 (see attachment).
Charles Salter Associates - \$44,230.00 (see attachment).
Terramar Environmental Services, Inc. - \$5,000.00 (see attachment).
RECON Environmental, Inc. - \$4,000.00 (see attachment).

Total Cost for Part 2: \$95,570.00

Part 3

Time Frame: Issuance of ROD up to final draft of Complaint.

Objective: Review and provide comments to the ROD. This is expected to be the final technical step preceding litigation relating to the FEIS.

Scope of Services: Substantive review and analysis of ROD, including identification of legal and procedural deficiencies; final review and analysis of FEIS in light of ROD for legal and procedural deficiencies; and preparation of Complaint against the FAA in “final” form for Town Council approval.

Cost: Stearns Miller Weaver – \$67,500.00 (270 hours at \$250 an hour).
The Four Gates Company - \$17,320.00 (see attachment).

Our firm, and the expert consultants, are sensitive to the fact that the Town has certain budgetary constraints that it operates under, and therefore, we have structured the proposal in a manner that provides the Town with the ability and flexibility to terminate the representation at any time (if the Town elects to do so). Furthermore, we estimate that the above time frames cover a three year period, although they may be shortened depending on when the FEIS and ROD are issued by the FAA. Finally, to the extent that there may be a need for additional expert consultants, we will obtain the Town Council’s approval before engaging such experts.

Dear Mr. Richards:

The Four Gates Company is pleased to present this proposal for additional services related to representing the Town of Davie in respect to the proposed Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport expansion. This proposal addresses continued review of the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), in its draft and final forms; review of the Part 150 study; preparation of mitigation estimates in coordination with Town staff; review of related applications and documents; coordination with Town staff and team members; coordination with other agencies through the State Clearinghouse to generate support for Town concerns; and, attendance at meetings and hearings.

The scope of work addressed in this proposal is supplied in three phases:

1. Work Leading to the Issuance of the Final EIS
2. Work Relating to the Final EIS
3. Work Relating to the Record of Decision

Because information from the FAA and Broward County is not available regarding the schedule for meetings, document issuance and related activities, it is difficult to fully anticipate related timeframes and costs. In addition, this scope assumes that given the more relaxed timeframes in this phase of work (our earlier work was under extremely tight timeframes) that Town staff will be more fully engaged and that portions of the work, particularly in mitigation impact estimates, can be conducted with Town assistance in order to minimize costs. Proposed work will address the following issues and areas in the DEIS: definition of the study area; land use (including impacts on plans and policies, public properties and open space); environmental justice; impact mitigation; and environmental (as it pertains to procedural or strategic approaches). Each major task and estimated costs associated with each task are described below:

Task 1: Work Leading to the Issuance of the Final EIS

- Complete an in-depth review of the DEIS in light of potential litigation, with special attention towards identifying potential NEPA and FAA rule challenges, including an outline of issues, comments, and strategies. This review will serve to further elaborate upon prior comments, as well as devise additional comments which may further support the Town's concerns. This work product may include review of public records not available during the initial analysis.
- Review all comment letters submitted on the DEIS and compile a list identifying areas where issues may overlap or support the Town of Davie position.
- Review the draft and final Part 150 study, with particular attention to assessments of impacts and proposed mitigation for impacts.
- Coordinate with the Florida State Clearinghouse and commenting agencies to ensure that they are aware of potential consistency issues identified by the Town of Davie team.
- Prepare an approach to Part 150 mitigation in coordination with Town staff, and submit as a formal letter or comment through the 150 Study. Our approach is expected to demand complete replacement of any impacted housing as intact neighborhoods, at set levels of affordability, with the Town. This task assumes that the Town's staff will be actively involved in any unit counts and will assist in an approach to replacement of impacted units.
- Attend a round table meeting with the consulting team and City staff to discuss the existing comments and strategize on approach. This includes sites visits to areas not already documented in the prior work efforts.
- Attend two meetings at the Town, one Part 150 meeting, and one additional meeting (most likely on Port Everglades).
- **Estimated Cost: \$30,990**

Task 2: Work Relating to the Final EIS

- In-depth review of the FEIS, including preparation of comments.
- Development strategy for other regulatory approaches and interventions, including Section 404 Permit (USACE).
- Attendance at one hearing and one meeting at the Town.
- **Estimated Cost: \$11,840**

Task 3: Work Relating to the Record of Decision


- In-depth review of the ROD, including preparation of comments in anticipation of litigation.
- Attendance at one Town meeting.
- **Estimated Cost: \$17,320**

Hello Richard:

Randy, Dennis and I have been putting our heads together to develop draft budgets and worksopes for the EIS and Part 150 program work in the three time periods, as you have requested. This is difficult because 1) we do not know the schedule for this work (these projects notoriously overrun, missing most deadlines to address all comments from everyone), 2) we do not know the extent of the analyses that may be required in the future, and 3) we do not know the extent of our face-to-face involvement (if any).

We plan to address all issues throughout the Part 150, identify issues and submit recommendations to you. These recommendations and resultant impacts often require modifying the input files to the INM (noise modeling program) and generating new contours. This may be fairly easy (e.g., for changes in traffic volume) or more difficult if we must generate new flight tracks.

At this time we have not budgeted any travel and assume that you will be the sole representative of our work. Travel time and expenses seem to add quite quickly at this distance.

So, the attached spreadsheet breaks things out for a reasonable level of support from home, without travel, annually for the next three years. We hope and expect that much of the Part 150 and EIS issues will be the same, and that you may just submit our work in a different form.

Please feel free to get back to me on this. I check my voicemail fairly often and will return your call from our trip here in Michigan.

At the suggestion of Ms. Amy Kimball-Murley of The Four Gates Company, we are submitting this proposal for environmental consulting services for your consideration. The services include assisting your firm with an analysis of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the expansion of the Ft. Lauderdale Airport. To assist in evaluating our qualifications, we have attached the vitae of the principal scientists that will be involved with this project.

The scope of services we offer is to analyze various aspects of the natural resource aspects of the DEIS including wetland delineations, wetland impacts, mitigation proposals, impacts to wildlife including threatened and endangered species, and procedural aspects of the DEIS with respect to natural resource issues. We will review the available information including wetland reports, mitigation proposals, and pertinent agency and public correspondence. Based on your message, I am forwarding a copy of a resume for David Gottfredson. Dave is our air and NEPA specialist and would be the primary individual reviewing the air section of the EIS. I anticipate that the effort for reviewing the air quality analysis would consider the EIS and technical study looking for inconsistencies, accuracy and conformance to regulatory requirements. We do not anticipate rerunning any of the air dispersion models. As I indicated to Dennis Hughes, we anticipate that we could complete this review for \$6,000.

This would result in a detailed review letter. This review letter could be submitted in response to the public review of the EIS or could be incorporated into a letter that addressed additional topics. I assume that this is what you refer to as your first time period.

The effort needed to review the response to our comments would, of course, depend upon what we found in our review and how the FAA responds. I would anticipate that we could review their response to our comments within a reasonably short amount of time. If we were to include up to \$4,000 for this review, we could provide the services for the first two time periods for \$10,000.
