

From the Desk of Mayor Judy Paul...



The Town is in the midst of its FY2015 budget season. On June 11, the Town Council held its first budget workshop to evaluate the existing Town's economic condition and to begin preparations for the upcoming year. At this time, the Town is projecting a balanced budget for the next fiscal year that will not utilize any one-time revenues sources, including reserves. This information is significant as the Town had a structural budget deficit that resulted in the use of one-time revenue sources over the past three years to balance the budget. The Town Council has strived to close this deficit through pension reform, reviewing and reducing ongoing expenditures, and seeking out new or enhanced revenue streams. These actions will reflect positively to the bond rating agencies. The Town's rating agencies (i.e., Standard & Poor's, Moody's) periodically visit with the Town and review the Town's finances. Upon their review, they will assess the Town a rating based on their credit rating tiers. These ratings will impact the Town's future ability to issue bonds at favorable interest rates. The higher the credit rating received, the lower the interest rate the Town will be able to utilize when issuing future bonds. Lower interest rates will directly benefit the taxpayers of the Town.

The Town Council and the Administration aggressively monitor the annual budget to ensure fiscal responsibility and stability. While our operating budget has stabilized, the Town's long-term capital needs remain a challenge. The Town has utilized reserves or other nonrecurring revenue since FY2010 to fund its Capital Improvement Program. Since FY 2010, the Town has used over \$6.8 million of General Fund reserves toward the Town's Capital Improvement Program. We do not have an ongoing funding source for capital; however, we have been able to appropriate \$750,000 for the Capital Improvement Program in FY2015. This funding is not suitable, and we will continue to pursue funding sources to ensure that unfunded projects that are worthy of funding are not delayed.

The Town of Davie has been a member of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) since 1976. This program enables all Davie residents to purchase federally backed flood insurance for their properties. Under the NFIP, all structures are required to be constructed per the federal floodplain management standards, including agricultural, non-residential structures. All property owners are also required to follow state and local floodplain standards during construction. Two events have recently triggered the need for the Town to evaluate and update its floodplain management ordinance.

In 2012, the Florida Building Code was updated to include flood provisions from the International Code Series. All new construction and substantially improved structures (excluding agricultural, non-residential structures) are required to comply with the Florida Building Code, including flood development criteria. The other event was the updating of the Federal Emergency Management Act (FEMA) flood maps for Broward County. For the past five years, FEMA has been conducting a study to update the flood hazard risk. FEMA's efforts are complete, and the new FEMA flood maps will become effective on August 18, 2014. Based on these new maps, many Davie properties will no longer be located in Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA). As a result, the Town had to update its floodplain management ordinance to ensure its continued participation in the NFIP and to maintain compliance with the updated Florida Building Code.

The Town Council heard the floodplain management ordinance on first reading at the June 11, 2014, meeting. One particular item raised concerns: the requirement for agricultural, non-residential structures to obtain a floodplain development permit prior to construction. This language is necessary for the Town's continued participation in the NFIP and is permissible per Florida Statutes. However, the Town has the right to define the policy whereby agricultural, non-residential structures will be required to obtain the floodplain development permit. The Town Council has asked for this policy in the form of a resolution to be brought back at the second reading of this ordinance on July 30. This policy will help to ensure that an undue burden is not placed on our agricultural community. We must always find a balance between all of our residents' needs, even when unfunded mandates come down from the State and/or Federal Agencies. This is why our Council fights so hard for home rule whenever the opportunity arises.

I look forward to seeing you at the Town's July 4th festivities at Pine Island Park. The event begins at 3 p.m. and includes activities such as live music, youth entertainment, and fireworks. See page 21 for further details.

In April, the Town Council and the Administration held community forums throughout the Town to update the residents on the Town's fiscal condition, five-year forecast, and ongoing Townwide and District capital projects. I found these forums to be educational and appreciate everyone attending the District 2 forums at Pine Island Ridge Community Center and Davie Town Hall.

On May 14, the Town and the Boys and Girls Club celebrated the grand opening of the Rick and Rita Case Boys and Girls Club Gymnasium. This facility expands the Boys and Girls Club program offerings in the Driftwood community. Members will enjoy a myriad of activities, including in-house basketball, dodgeball and flag football games, and leagues; relay races; team-building activities; exercise clinics; and Hula Hoop and jump rope contests. The Rick and Rita Case Club is home to more than 700 members ages 6 to 18 with an average daily attendance of over 200 youth.

The Shenandoah Park improvements are beginning to take shape. In March 2014, the new playground was installed which was picked and designed by the Shenandoah community. The playground includes equipment for ages 3 to 5 and 6 to 12, a swing set, rubberized safety surface, and shade canopies. I want to acknowledge and thank the Shenandoah Homeowners Association for its

financial contribution that enabled us to deliver an enhanced product to the community.

During the summer, the Town will be repaving S.W. 130th Avenue from State Road 84 to S.W. 36th Court and S.W. 36th Court from S.W. 130th Avenue to Flamingo Road. I requested this project in this year's Capital Improvement Program, and I am happy to see it coming to fruition. Please note the maintenance of traffic for this project and stay alert for workers as you drive on these roadways.

Hurricane season has started. To ensure the safety of your loved ones, I encourage you to review the hurricane and flood preparedness information in this issue. Your family will find tips on having a hurricane preparedness plan; minimizing losses to your home; and ensuring their safety from flooding. Please remember to sign up for our Citizen Alert system to ensure that you receive notifications during emergencies. With the alert system you may enter several different phone numbers where you can be contacted. The system will also send text messages. By going to the front page of the Davie website at www.davie-fl.gov and click on the red Town of Davie Alerts button, you can enter your information and edit it at any time. Hurricane Preparedness

Hurricane season began June 1 and ends November 30. Please stay prepared throughout the season. Remember that while the Town, county, state, and federal governments do have various responsibilities to residents, the members of each family must prepare to take care of themselves for at least five days. The following information will help to guide you in the preparation process.

Have a Plan

- Hold a family meeting and discuss your plan with the entire family. Children need to know the things that you are doing to make them safe.
- Discuss whether you will need to evacuate. All mobile homes are considered to be in an evacuation zone and if the order to evacuate is given, then all Davie residents who reside in mobile homes must comply.
- Ensure that your assets are protected. Inventory your home possessions and videotape, record, or photograph items of value. Review your insurance policy.
- Assess your home for vulnerable areas. Do a walk-through of your home and property to evaluate your roof, windows, garage door, landscaping, etc., to determine what actions you will take.
- Make a plan to protect your vehicles.
- Secure your home and decide what actions you will need to take to protect your home and property. Be sure to move all trash and recycle cans indoors. Trucks will stop running when sustained winds reach 45 mph. Davie Community Buses stop running when sustained winds reach 35 mph.
- Register ahead of time for those with special needs at the special needs shelter.
- Make plans for pets.
- Gather supplies. Determine your family's food, water, and medical needs, and assemble your hurricane kit.
- Notify others of your plan. Let friends or family know your hurricane plan so that they can check on you in the aftermath of the storm. Establish an out-of-town contact.

In the event of a hurricane or other emergency, some residents are required to evacuate their homes. This can be especially difficult for residents who are disabled, have special medical needs, or who are otherwise vulnerable during an emergency. To the extent possible, shelters provide residents with a safe place to stay and basic assistance to help them get through the emergency. Residents who must evacuate their homes have several options to consider:

Option One – Stay with Family or Friends Outside the Evacuation Zone

If you must evacuate your home, either because you live in an evacuation zone, you live in a mobile home (in the event of a weather emergency), or you feel unsafe in your home, your best choice is to stay with family or friends in a location outside the evacuation zone. This is where you will be most comfortable.

Option Two – Make Reservations at a Hotel Outside the Evacuation Zone

Option Three – Stay in a Mass Care Shelter

American Red Cross Mass Care Shelters provide a basic level of care and are open to all. No preregistration is required. If you have a self-managed health condition or disability, you will likely be able to shelter comfortably in a mass care shelter. When you arrive at the shelter, be sure to tell shelter personnel what your needs are. If you need transfer assistance, sign language interpretation and other auxiliary aids, or a quiet zone for a cognitive disability or mental health need, call 954-831-4000 or TTY 954-831-3940 for the most updated information. Fox Trail Elementary School, 1250 Nob Hill Road, Davie, is a designated American Red Cross Shelter.

Option Four – Stay in a Special Medical Needs Shelter

If you have a medical condition that requires a greater level of care than that provided at a mass care shelter, but you do not require hospitalization, a Special Medical Needs Shelter may be appropriate for you. These shelters offer basic medical assistance and monitoring. They are staffed by qualified medical personnel and have backup electricity for limited lighting and essential medical equipment. Family members and caregivers are encouraged to accompany residents with special medical needs. Preregistration is encouraged for planning and response purposes, but not required. Call the Broward County Human Services Department at 954-357-6385 (TTY 954-357-5608) for an application or for any questions you may have.

Option Five – Stay in a Hospital or Other Medical Facility

If your medical condition exceeds the level of care provided at a special medical-needs shelter or you require hospitalization or one-on-one care, we recommend you work with your physician or medical provider to arrange the safest shelter option for you, which may include a hospital or other medical facility.

Red Cross Pet Shelter

A pet friendly shelter operated by the American Red Cross and the Broward County Humane Society is available to residents with pets that either live in an evacuation area or in a mobile home anywhere in Broward County. Preregistration is required. To register, call 954-989-3977.

Your safety is our top concern. Early warning helps save lives and property. That's why the Town of Davie wants to make sure that you know about emergencies and disasters as they happen.

The Town of Davie uses the Everbridge SmartGIS System to let you know about issues that may affect your safety. The Everbridge System will allow the Town of Davie to contact thousands of residents in seconds so that you can find out about an emergency right away.

The Everbridge SmartGIS System can deliver messages to you in any way you want—on your home phone, cell phone, or by email. This way, we can reach you in any emergency. We may also use the system in nonemergency situations to let you know about important Town-related events, such as meetings and road closures, if you choose to register for that feature.

The process begins when the Town issues a message about a potential safety hazard or concern. Messages will be sent to all standard voice and text communication devices, including listed landline phones, cell phones, and email. If you don't confirm receipt of the message, the system will try to reach your second contact number or email. The system will continue trying to contact you until it receives a confirmation from you.

Your help is critical.

The success of this service relies on you. Having your latest contact information is the only way to ensure that we can contact you in an emergency. Please register your contact information as soon as possible. Registering is easy and only takes a few minutes. Just go to www.davie-fl.gov, and click on the Davie Citizen Alert Button on the front page.

DAVIE OFFERS LARGE ANIMAL HURRICANE RELEASE PROGRAM

The Town of Davie is currently accepting preregistration applications for a Temporary Release Program for large animals. The Town will open a neighborhood center to serve as a holding area before and during a hurricane or natural disaster. In order to qualify for the temporary release program, you must be a Davie resident or your horse must be boarded in or live in Davie.



Once a hurricane warning has been issued, the site will open for preregistered horses only. This site will reopen to retrieve your horses when the winds have subsided to a minimum of 40 mph. You are encouraged to visit the site for yourself before completing your preregistration form to determine whether you feel it is safer than your current situation. Remember, this turnout site is for Davie residents, or your horse must be boarded in or live in Davie.

The cost for the program is \$40 per horse. This fee must be included with your preregistration. Flood Insurance Information

Congress created the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) in response to the rising cost of taxpayer-funded disaster relief for flood victims. The NFIP makes federally backed flood insurance available in communities that agree to adopt and to enforce floodplain management ordinances to reduce further flood damage. In addition, the NFIP's Community Rating System (CRS) rewards community floodplain management activities that exceed program standards with flood insurance premium discounts for that community.

The Town of Davie has participated in the CRS program since 1992. Through the annual accreditation process, the Town is a Class 7 community, which gives Davie residents living in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) a 15% discount on their flood insurance. Residents living in a non-SFHA zone receive a 5% discount.

New FEMA Flood Maps Effective August 18, 2014

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has finalized the new flood maps which become effective on August 18, 2014.

Residents and businesses in the Town of Davie are encouraged to view the new flood maps to better understand their potential flood risk and to help identify steps they may need to take to protect against property damage and loss.

The new flood maps can be accessed from the internet on the Town of Davie home page found at <http://www.davie-fl.gov> by clicking on the link in the HOT TOPICS section of the page on the link entitled "NEW FLOOD MAPS".

Local Flood Hazard

A large portion of the Town of Davie is located within an environmentally sensitive drainage region known as the C-11 basin. The storm water runoff for this basin flows through secondary canals into the C-11 canal. For areas east of Nob Hill Road, the C-11 canal drains into the Atlantic Ocean. For areas west of Nob Hill Road, runoff is pumped into the Everglades.

The most recent demonstration of Davie's flood hazard occurred during Hurricane Irene in 1999. Davie received extensive rainfall that inundated the drainage system. In response to this event, the Town made drainage improvements in Green Acres, Little Country Estates, Oak Hill, Orange Park, Playland Village, Royal Palm Estates, Sequoia Estates, Silver Lake, Sunnyland Farms, Sunshine Village, and Vista Filare.

The Town Council has commissioned a stormwater master plan to review the Town existing drainage infrastructure and determine the future needs of the system.

Flood Insurance

Standard homeowner's insurance policies do not cover losses due to floods. Flood insurance is available to any owner of insurable property (a building or its contents). Renters may also insure their personal property against flood loss. The average annual premium for flood insurance is \$420. The actual cost will vary depending upon the amount of coverage and the degree of the flood hazard. Residents can purchase policies up to \$250,000 for their homes and \$100,000 for contents. Nonresidential structures can be protected up to \$500,000 for the structure and \$500,000 for contents. We urge people who live or own property in flood-hazard areas to purchase flood insurance to protect themselves from losses due to flooding. There is a 30-day waiting period before NFIP coverage takes effect. Please note that flood insurance is required for properties with a



federally backed mortgage. This insurance is especially poignant since there is a 26% chance of experiencing a flood during the life of a 30-year mortgage.

Flood Safety

You should consider the following to minimize loss to your home and to ensure your family's safety.

What Should I Do Before A Flood?

- Take photos or videos of your important possessions.
- Post emergency telephone numbers by the phone, and teach children to dial 911.
- Plan and practice a flood evacuation route with your family.
- Establish an out-of-state "family contact person" and assure that everyone in your family knows that person's name, address, and phone number.
- For drains, toilets, and other sewer connections, install backflow valves or plugs to prevent floodwaters from entering.

What Should I Do During A Flood?

- Fill bathtubs, sinks, and jugs with clean water.
- Listen to a battery-operated radio to keep you informed.
- If instructed, turn off all utilities at the main power switch and the main gas valve.
- If told to evacuate your home, do so immediately.
- If waters start to rise inside your house, retreat to the highest floor, attic, and, if necessary, the roof.
- If you've come in contact with floodwaters, wash your hands with soap and disinfected water.
- Avoid walking through floodwater; as little as six inches of moving water can knock you off your feet.
- Do not drive through a flooded area. If you come upon a flooded road, take another route.
- Stay away from downed power lines or electrical wires.
- Look out for animals.

What Should I Do After A Flood?

- If your home has suffered damage, call your insurance agent.
- Take photos of any water in the house, and save damaged personal property for insurance purposes.
- Check for structural damage before reentering your home, and do not enter if a portion of the building has collapsed.
- Upon reentering your property, do not use matches and cigarette lighters since gas may be trapped inside. If you smell gas or hear hissing, open a window, quickly, and call the gas company from a neighbor's home.
- Keep power off until an electrician has inspected your system for safety.
- Check for sewage and water line damage. If you suspect damage, avoid using the

- tap, and call a plumber.
- Throw away any food – including canned goods – that has come in contact with floodwater.
- Until local authorities declare your water supply to be safe, boil water for drinking and preparation.

Property Protection Measures

Property protection measures, including retrofitting, should be taken with the onset of a flood or if your home is susceptible to flooding. If flooding is likely and time permits, move essential items and furniture to the upper areas of your home.

Keep materials like sandbags, plywood, plastic sheeting, and lumber handy for emergency waterproofing. This action will help to minimize the amount of property damage caused by floodwaters.

Retrofitting involves the modification of surrounding terrain and your home to reduce the risk of flooding. Surrounding terrain modifications include the installation of an earthen berm or small floodwall.



Home modifications include raising the home, waterproofing the walls, and elevating electrical panel boxes, furnaces, water heaters, and washers and dryers to locations less likely to be flooded. If you need property protection or retrofitting advice, please contact the Engineering Department at 954-797-1113.

FEMA grants can be obtained to assist residents in retrofitting their homes. For more information, contact the Engineering Division at 954-797-1113, or visit www.FEMA.gov.

The Town of Davie is an area subject to tropical storms and hurricanes. Homeowners should mitigate for high winds. These mitigation measures include the installation of storm shutters, shatter-resistant windows, and reinforced garage doors. Please visit Floridadisaster.org to get information on strengthening your home. Natural and Beneficial Functions

State regulations protect those natural areas that help to reduce the risks associated with flooding. When portions of floodplains are preserved in (or restored to) their natural state, they provide many benefits to both human and natural systems. In particular, the Everglades Aquifer, which provides drinking water to the South Florida area, benefits from the preservation of natural areas. These benefits range from providing aesthetic pleasure to reducing the number and the severity of floods, to helping handle storm water runoff and minimizing non-point water pollution. Nonpoint is the opposite of a direct pipe or point pollution discharge. For example, by allowing floodwater to slow down, sediments settle out,

thus maintaining water quality. The natural vegetation filters out impurities and uses excess nutrients.

Flood Warning System

The Broward County Office of Emergency Management, in coordination with the National Weather Service, relays updates of threatening weather to government and media outlets. Flood warnings or watch advisories are issued through local radio and TV stations. These advisories are broadcast on radio (including WIOD 610 AM and WFTL 1400 AM), television (including WFOR–Channel 4, WTVJ–Channel 6, WSVN–Channel 7, and WPLG–Channel 10), and other media outlets.

The Town also has an information hotline that provides details on advisories relating to emergencies, including hurricanes. This hotline is updated as necessary and can be reached at 954-797-1122.

Floodplain Development Permit Requirements

The Town of Davie has adopted regulations on floodplain development. The regulations control the alteration of the natural floodplains; prevent or regulate the construction of flood barriers which will unnaturally divert floodwaters or which may increase flood hazards in other areas; restrict or prohibit uses which may result in damaging increases in erosion or in flood heights or velocities; and control filling, grading, dredging, and other development which may increase flood damages.

Davie regulates development through the review process whereby building and engineering permits are required prior to construction, filling, or otherwise altering the natural elevations of a site. Prior to commencing site development or construction work, it is recommended that the Engineering Division be contacted at 954-797-1113. To report illegal floodplain development, please contact the Engineering Division.

Elevation certificates are required as part of the permitting process for all newly constructed or substantially improved buildings in Davie. The certificate documents the base flood elevation (BTE) of new buildings and is available to any inquirers. To find out if an elevation certificate has been completed for your property, call the Building Division at 954-797-1111.

Substantial Improvement/Damage Requirements

According to the Davie Building Code, a substantial improvement is defined as “any repair, reconstruction, or improvement of a structure, the cost of which equals or exceeds 50% of the market value of the structure before the repair is started or if the structure is damaged and is being restored before the damage occurred.” Substantially improved buildings must meet the same construction requirements as a new building. Similarly damaged buildings, where repair will cost 50% or more of the original building value before the damage occurred, must be brought up to current building code and floodplain management regulations. The floodplain management regulations include that the lowest finished floor must be at or above the BFE. The Town building officials make the determination as to whether a structure is considered substantially improved or substantially damaged.



Drainage Systems Maintenance

The Town is served by a manmade system of primary and tributary canals and swale areas that were constructed originally to drain the Everglades and now accommodate the flow of water for storm water management purposes. These drainage features are critical to the success of water management practices which are incorporated into the development review process. State law prohibits dumping or unauthorized obstructions or alterations of the drainage canals or swale areas. Illegal dumping can lead to clogged swales and canals that will not properly carry water away during a rain event. To report illegal dumping, please contact Code Compliance at 954-693-8237.

The Town's canal system is maintained on a regular basis by the local drainage districts. These districts include the Central Broward Water Control District, the South Broward Drainage District, the South Florida Water Management District, and the Tindall Hammock Drainage District.

The Public Works Department conducts an annual inspection of the drainage system to ensure proper maintenance. To report a drainage problem, residents can contact the Public Works Department at 954-797-1240 or can access the Town's Citizen Support Center by clicking "Talk To Us" on the Town's website, www.davie-fl.gov.





Join the Davie Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)


The Davie Fire Rescue Department offers free training for the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) to anyone who lives or works in the Town of Davie and who is over 18 years old. Classes meet from 6 to 8:30 p.m. for eight weeks at the Davie Fire Administration Building located at 6901 Orange Drive. You must register before the class begins. Go to www.davie-fl.gov to download the CERT application.

The CERT program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training taught in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when public safety personnel are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to take a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community. From the Senior Citizen Advisory Committee

We have had a very productive year from September 2013 to May 2014. We hope you have noticed the new screen, AV equipment, and our new meeting room at the Pine Island Multipurpose Center. We are delighted to have a meeting place that we can call home. Thanks to the generous donation by Mayor Paul we are able to purchase a wireless microphone to use at our committee meetings.

We would like to encourage you to attend a meeting and voice your concerns and recommendations. We are happy to report that a couple of seniors did just that recently, and we were able to bring the concern to the appropriate person for resolution. Don't just grumble, take action!

Two of our members attended a Senior Zone Workshop in West Park conducted by Buddy Cloud from the Department of Elder Affairs. Our committee came back enthused about a transportation workshop that focused on increasing safety in senior zones by reduced speed limits and increased pedestrian walk time in crosswalks. We are happy to report that Buddy Cloud will provide a transportation workshop about what Florida is doing through the Safe and Mobile Senior Coalition managed by DOT that will incorporate the Senior Zone concept. At our April 8 meeting, Andi Kola, Community Outreach Coordinator for Pets' Broward, addressed the committee regarding the shelter statistics of the animal shelters in Broward County. Public Works Department Landscape Division

The Town of Davie celebrated both Earth Day and Arbor Day in April with hundreds of students from American Heritage, Silver Ridge, and Whispering Pines who mulched and planted flowers, shrubs, and trees in several different Town locations. Many thanks to them and to Angel's Landscaping, EDJ Services, and the Florida Forest Service who volunteered to assist the students. The Public Works Department's Landscaping Division facilitated the event with Urban Forester Tim Lee at the helm. The Public Works staff members who assisted him were Eddie Butler, Ron Hunt, Chris Stratman, Russell Alexander, and Winston Thomas.

There were approximately 200 plants planted at Town Hall the first day, including coontie, white indigo berry, dune sunflower, yellow bulbine, penta, and pitch apple. "We chose drought-tolerant plants, many of which are colorful and some that provide wildlife benefits," said Urban Forester Tim Lee.

Mr. Lee continued, "On the second day, we planted about 100 plants at Pine Island Park that included tamarind trees, white stopper trees, cordyline plants, wild peanut, and cocoplum. We planted about 130 plants at the Public Works office on the third day, including horizontal juniper, plumbago, jatropha, green island ficus, and bromeliads."

On April 29, for Arbor Day, approximately 100 stopper trees, fiddlewood trees, black ironwood trees, and wild coffee plants were planted at the park. Some students had never used a shovel before and were taught how to dig a hole, how to get the plant out of the container, how deep to place the plant, and how to fill the hole and water the plant and tree. Mr. Lee also discussed the purpose of our planting project and why certain trees were selected. The trees were ideal for those particular site conditions and also provided food and cover for wildlife. The students had a great time, and it was obvious from their eager participation and enthusiasm.

A certified arborist from EDJ Services discussed tree maintenance and why we prune trees as part of the tree care. He displayed the equipment he used and then went up high in the bucket truck to trim some tree limbs for the students.

The Florida Forestry Service came with a tractor and plow used to cut fire lines and stop wildfires from advancing. They also showed the students their personal protection gear and discussed good fire and bad wildfire. They explained how fire can be used as a very good forestry management tool by the experts, along with how it can cause severe damage when it is out of control. Two forest rangers from the Florida Forest Service made the presentation.

Angel Garcia from Angel's Landscaping Service volunteered his landscaping expertise during the Town Hall planting. He provided equipment and taught the students how to plant sustainable landscaping.

In addition, an essay contest was held for the participating fourth graders. The essay topic was "Why Trees Are Important." The papers were exceptional and the top three were read to their classes and awarded prizes by Vice Mayor Hattan. The students learned to appreciate trees and to think about how important trees are to the community and our health. They were taught about wildfires and the importance of what the forest rangers do. The students learned about maintaining and planting plants and trees and how to have a fun time doing it. According to the teachers, the project was very successful, and they look forward to it next year.
