From the Desk of Mayor Judy Paul...



On September 21, 2016, the Davie Town Council approved the FY2017 budget. The Town continues to find and to implement innovative ways to ensure that we are keeping our millage rates as one of the lowest in Broward County while providing exceptional service to our residents. For FY2017, the operating millage rate is 5.0799 mills, which has been reduced two years in a row. The debt service millage rate for FY2017 is .6163, which is 13.9% less than the millage rate levied for FY2016. Town Administrator Richard J. Lemack and staff take on the challenge every year to ensure that the Town's budget is not only fiscally viable but serves and addresses the needs of our residents.

On the November 8, 2016 ballot, Broward County residents will have the opportunity to vote on a 1% sales surtax that will be utilized to fund transportation projects and local infrastructure improvements: 1/2 penny for Broward County transportation projects and the other 1/2 penny for local infrastructure improvement projects. To educate the public about the A Penny At Work Campaign, the Town held three town-wide meetings and gave presentations at dozens of

homeowner association meetings, boards and committees, and civic organizations throughout the Town. For more information, please see pages 6 and 7.

One of the initiatives we proposed in last year's budget is reestablishing a mounted patrol in Davie. I am happy to announce that with a lot of hard work and dedication, our first mounted patrol officers in over 15 years graduated recently. The mounted unit can be seen in and around Davie patrolling our trails, our open spaces, interacting with our residents, and taking part in community-oriented events. The unit is an invaluable asset to our Police Department.

As you all know, I am an animal lover and activist. I am thrilled that our Davie Police Department has welcomed a new addition to its team. Rocky, a Labrador Retriever, is Broward County's first therapy dog. Rocky and his handler, Detective Lisa Choquette, will assist the Special Victims Unit, currently working with children ages 2 to 12 years old. At a later date, Rocky will assist adults who are in need of service. As an animal community, Rocky is a welcome addition to our family.

The Town recently passed a resolution affirming its opposition to the Florida Environmental Regulatory Commission's decision to raise the limits on the amount of known carcinogens and toxic waste allowed to be dumped into waterways and reaffirming its opposition to extreme oil stimulation (also known as fracking). The Town firmly believes in protecting and preserving its natural open space environment, wildlife habitat, and water resources. The best way we can protect these resources is by proactively preventing contamination and environmental pollution. The Town will continue to work with Broward County and other municipalities to oppose practices that endanger our environment and drinking water supply.

I recently attended the Broward County Council of Professional Fire Fighters 30th Annual Fire Fighters Meet & Greet Awards Dinner where I was awarded with the Municipal Leaders of the Year Award. I want to thank the Davie Fire Fighters Benevolent Association Local 2315 for nominating me for this prestigious award. I feel honored to have received this award and will proudly display it.

The newest farmers market, Marando Farms and Ranch, recently held its grand opening. The country-style theme store, located at 5151 S.W. 64th Avenue, will provide locally grown produce, bakery items, meat, fish, organic eggs, an animal interaction/observation area, petting zoo, community garden, picnic pavilions, and a host of other attractions. I look forward to visiting the market on a regular basis.

The Annual Veterans Day Ceremony will be held on Friday, November 11, 2016, at Veterans Park, 5750 S.W. 39th Street, beginning at 10 a.m. This patriotic ceremony will feature a wreath-laying ceremony, bagpipes, a 21-gun salute, and presentation of certificates of recognition to our specially invited veterans. Richie Supa, formerly of Aerosmith, will also be in attendance and will be performing. We cherish and proudly celebrate our veterans who have done so much for our country. Your safety is our top concern. Early warning helps save lives and property. That is why the Town of Davie wants to make sure that you know about emergencies and disasters as they happen.

The system can deliver messages to you in any way you want on your home phone, cell phone, or by email. We may also use the system in nonemergency situations to let you know about important Town-related events, such as meetings and road closures, if you choose to register for that feature.

The process begins when the Town issues a message about a potential safety hazard or concern. Messages will be sent to all standard voice and text communication devices, including listed landline phones, cell phones, and emails. If you do not confirm receipt of the message, the system will try to reach your second contact number or email. The system will continue to try to contact you until it receives a confirmation from you.

Your help is critical.

The success of this service relies on you. Having your latest contact information is the only way to ensure that we can contact you in an emergency. Please register your contact information as soon as possible. Registering is easy and only takes a few minutes. Visit www.davie-fl.gov, and click on the Davie Citizen Alert Button on the front page.

A Penny At Work

1/2 Penny For Transportation

1/2 Penny For Local Infrastructure

Both Must Pass or Both Will Fail

On the November 8, 2016, Ballot, Broward County residents will be asked to vote on a 1% sales tax to fund transportation and local infrastructure projects for 30 years. There will be two questions on the ballot: 1/2 a penny to fund Broward County transportation projects and the other 1/2 a penny to fund local municipal infrastructure projects. Both must pass or both will fail.

The revenue generated from one 1/2 penny will be utilized by Broward County to fund transportation projects such as light rail, new rapid bus transit system, expanded senior mobility, traffic signal synchronization, adaptive signal controls, intersection improvements, and school zone improvements.

The other 1/2 penny will be utilized by the Town of Davie and other municipalities throughout Broward County for infrastructure projects. In the first year, the Town will receive approximately \$8 million, the first 10 years approximately \$90 million, and for the entirety of the surtax, the Town will receive approximately \$300 million. Some of the Davie projects that will be funded include:

Public Buildings

- New Community Centers (Betty Booth Roberts Park, Davie Golf and Country Club, Davie Wetlands Park)
- Community Center Expansions (Pine Island Multipurpose Center)/Replacements (Ivanhoe, Orange Park)
- Bergeron Rodeo Grounds Improvements
- Police Department Parking Garage

Public Facilities

- Water and Sewer Mains and Lines
- Playground Replacements and Canopies Installation

Public Safety Vehicles and Equipment

- Fire Rescue Ambulances
- Fire Engines and Aerial Truck

Roads/Transportation/Pedestrian Safety

- Signalization (Forest Ridge Blvd and Pine Island Rd)
- SW 136 Avenue and SW 14 Street Traffic Improvements
- Roadway Resurfacing (\$2 million annually)
- Regional Activity Center Roadway Enhancements (SW 30 Street, SW 39 Street, Davie Road, College Avenue)
- Sidewalks
- Guardrails

“The surtax is a great opportunity for us to fund some of our infrastructure projects that have been on the back burner,” said Mayor Judy Paul. “In our most recent Capital Improvements Program, the Town had over \$77 million in unfunded projects.”

A nine-member oversight committee will be appointed to review and to approve/deny projects submitted by the county and municipalities, ensure funds are spent according to the Statute and ballot language, and monitor the progress of the projects.

No member of the Oversight Board shall, at any time during his or her term, be an elected official or have an employment or contractual relationship with either Broward County or any of the municipalities.

BALLOT LANGUAGE

The images below show the language that will be on the November ballot regarding the sales taxes. The Broward Supervisor of Elections provides the ballot language in English, Spanish, and Creole. The translation to Portuguese is provided for information only. The ballot will not be translated into Portuguese on Election Day.

FUNDING FOR COUNTYWIDE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM THROUGH THE LEVY OF A ONE-HALF PERCENT SALES SURTAX

Shall transportation improvements to reduce traffic congestion, develop rail and enhance bus systems, improve roads and signalizations, and develop safe sidewalk and bicycle pathways, be funded by levying a 30-year, 0.5% sales surtax, paid by residents and visitors, with all proceeds held in trust, expenditures overseen by an independent oversight board, and this levy effective only if the infrastructure surtax ballot question below is voter-approved and in effect.

YES — check this if you want to fund transportation improvements by increasing the sales tax by 0.5% (half a percent)

NO — check this if you do not want to fund transportation improvements by increasing the sales tax

Annotations:

- Surtax means an additional tax on something already taxed
- Levy means to charge or to collect a tax or fee
- Should transportation improvements be paid for by adding .5% (half of 1 percent) to the existing 6% sales tax
- If both these ballots pass, then everyone who buys a taxable item will pay this added tax
- An independent group of people will watch how the money is spent to ensure that it is spent correctly.

Both the ballot question to increase sales tax .5% to fund transportation AND the ballot question to increase sales tax .5% to fund infrastructure must pass for the sales tax to increase. If one ballot question fails, then they both will fail.

FUNDING FOR LOCAL INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS THROUGH LEVY OF A ONE-HALF PERCENT SALES SURTAX

Shall construction and improvement of public buildings, facilities and roads, transportation projects, pedestrian safety projects, purchase of equipment and public safety vehicles, and recreation/conservation land acquisition, be funded by levying a 30-year, 0.5% sales surtax, paid by residents and visitors, with all proceeds held in trust, expenditures overseen by an independent oversight board, and this levy effective only if the Transportation surtax ballot question immediately above is voter-approved and in effect.

FOR THE 0.5 CENT SALES TAX — check this if you want to fund infrastructure improvements by increasing the sales tax by 0.5% (half a percent)

AGAINST THE 0.5 CENT SALES TAX — check this if you do not want to fund infrastructure improvements by increasing the sales tax

Annotations:

- Levy means to charge or to collect a tax or fee
- Surtax means an additional tax on something already taxed
- Should infrastructure improvements be paid for by adding .5% (half of 1 percent) to the existing 6% sales tax
- If both these ballots pass, then everyone who buys a taxable item will pay this added tax
- An independent group of people will watch how the money is spent to ensure that it is spent correctly.

PACE Broward

The Broward County Board of County Commissioners recently approved a countywide property-assessed clean energy

(PACE) program providing an innovative form of financing for clean energy and resilience improvements for residential and commercial property owners across the county.



What is PACE?

PACE allows property owners to receive up-front financing for qualifying improvements such as energy conservation, renewable energy, and wind resistance. Property owners voluntarily agree to the program terms for financing qualifying improvement projects and repay through a non-ad valorem special assessment added to their property tax bill.

Qualifying improvements include rooftop solar panels, solar water heater, wind turbine, energy-efficient air conditioning unit, cool roof, window replacement, impact windows, insulation, and more. In general, improvements include most products that can be permanently affixed to a property and reduce on-site electric usage, assist in wind resistance, and/or produce onsite electricity. For questions regarding specific qualifying improvements, contact the individual PACE providers.

There may be other types of financing available to the property owners, and Broward County does not guarantee that the PACE program is the best financing option. Property owners should obtain help in selecting the option that is most appropriate for their particular financial situation.

PACE Providers

Broward County has entered into nonexclusive agreements with two PACE providers: Renew Financial, administering the “RenewPACE Program,” and Ygrene, administering the “Clean Energy Program.” Both PACE providers administer financing for residential and commercial projects. Each PACE provider will have a list of participating contractors to choose from. Call Renew: 844-736-393. Call Ygrene: 855-965-7283. The county is currently in negotiations with two additional PACE providers, with the goal of providing property owners with consumer choice.

To Get Started with PACE

Understand that each PACE provider has program guidelines and that there are differences with the two providers administering the program in Broward County. Property owners should download the program guidelines from the Renew Financial Residential Program Handbook, and the Ygrene Program Guidelines, before choosing a provider and submitting an application.

It is highly recommended that property owners perform a comprehensive energy audit on their property before committing to qualifying improvements. To find an energy auditor, contact RESNET, BPI, or the Florida Building Energy Rating System Program. Also, FPL offers free energy audits for customers. Visit the Department of Energy's Energy Saver webpage for more information on professional home energy audits.

Under Florida law, property taxes stay with the property when it is sold, and the same is true of an assessment. However, the seller's lender or the buyer's lender (mortgage company) may require the seller to pay off the remaining outstanding balance of the assessment before the property owner refinances or sells the property. In addition, by law, property owners must provide notice of the assessment to the buyer prior to sale of the property.

Current Municipal Partners

Coconut Creek, Cooper City, Davie, Hillsboro Beach, Lauderdale-By-The-Sea, Lighthouse Point, North Lauderdale, Oakland Park, Parkland, Plantation, Sunrise, Tamarac, Weston, and Wilton Manors. Additional PACE providers interested in offering qualifying improvements within Broward County must meet the PACE Provider Standards and negotiate agreements with the County. Contractors must register with each or either of the Broward PACE providers.


