

Mayor Judy Paul's State of the Town Message



The year 2015 was a good year for the Town of Davie. We saw the fruits of our labor and commitment to diversifying and growing the community. Our future is strong and remains bright.

The Town strives to provide the highest levels of services, continues to enhance the Town's economic standing, and ensures the Capital Improvement Plan is aligned to meet the long-term infrastructure needs while sustaining current and future development.

Residential and Commercial Development continues to surge in the Town. In 2015, the Town saw over \$100 million in new residential and commercial construction projects completed and added to the tax rolls. In the first half of 2016, three residential projects will open: Palm Ranch, the Town at University, and Shalimar. Later this year, the Town anticipates groundbreaking for two assisted living facilities and multiple single-family and multi-family developments. As a result, the Town's population is expected to exceed 100,000 residents in 2017. Just as important the Town has maintained its commitment to the preservation of park and open space. While the typical level of service for parks and open space is 3 to 5 acres of space per 1,000 people; the

Town's level of service is 10 acres per 1,000 people, which is geographically spread across our community.

We have seen significant growth on University Drive as we welcomed Whole Foods and Trader Joe's. Additionally, Tower Shops undertook a 50,000 square foot expansion; the Shoppes at Arrowhead were renovated; and 2101 University Drive opened. Other notable projects include the Value Place Hotel on Reese Road; the opening of two emergency rooms, Westside Regional and Florida Medical; and the opening of three new car dealerships, Alfa Romeo, Maserati, and Lamborghini on I-75.

The Town and the CRA is investing significantly in the infrastructure improvements within the Davie Road Corridor. The Eastside Improvement Project will install a master stormwater drainage system and eliminate the use of septic systems as all lots on the east side of Davie Road will be connected to a sewer system. Upgrades will also be made to the water system to provide better water pressure and to support the addition of more fire hydrants. The Westside Project involves the installation of a master stormwater drainage system to eliminate individual retention areas. These projects would not be feasible if it were not for the CRA statutory authority making these improvements possible.

The Town is currently widening Davie Road to six lanes between State Road 84 and Nova Drive. This project is scheduled to be completed in Spring 2016. Enhancement projects are also planned for the remainder of Davie Road from Nova Drive to Orange Drive. These projects are designed to make the corridor safer for pedestrians and bike riders while increasing vehicle safety.

There is so much to be grateful for in our community over the past year. The Town served as a host to the Maccabi Games, an international athletic and artistic event which brought thousands of Jewish teen participants and guardians to Davie. We were also the recipients of two beautiful murals at the Old Davie School and the Pine Island Multipurpose Center. The mural at the Old Davie School perfectly captures the influences of the past, the evolution of our present, and the vision of our future. The piece at Pine Island captures the pure essence of our Town as the colorful horses depict the vibrant nature of Davie.

The Town Council is always seeking ways to enhance the public safety of our community. For the first time in many years, a part-time mounted police patrol unit will be coming back to the force. The mounted unit proves practical to the Town as we have hundreds of trail miles often inaccessible by traditional vehicles. Our Fire Rescue Department was the recipient of over \$2 million in federally funded grants to purchase self-contained breathing apparatus and cover salary and benefit costs for two years of 12 new-hire firefighters to meet the needs of our growing community. These firefighters will be critical as the Town prepares to move forward with the construction of Fire Station 86 in Shenandoah.

The Town continues seeking to preserve its home rule authority and preserve our community in Tallahassee. Annually, the Town sets its legislative agenda as a plan of action in influencing the budget and policy process. This year, group homes and the Seminole Tribe Gambling Compact negotiations head up the agenda. Town staff is working to bring reform to group home operations and accountability. As the Seminole Tribe seeks to expand its gaming portfolio at the nearby Hard Rock Hotel and Casino, the Town is remaining steadfast to make sure it receives its fair share of the revenue sharing to deal with the impact of the facility.

The Town of Davie Election for District 4 will be held on Tuesday, March 15, 2016. I am encouraging residents to come out and vote for the representative of their choice. Beginning in 2018, elections will be held in November instead of March. The Town Council elected in November 2018 will serve for a period of four years.

It is with deep regret that on February 1, 2016, the Town lost a valued leader when Fire Chief/Emergency Manager Joseph Montopoli passed away. Chief Montopoli was a 35-year veteran in the fire rescue service and was well respected throughout the Town of Davie and Broward County. Please see page 5 for a tribute to Chief Montopoli's legacy.

I want to start off my message by wishing everyone a Happy New Year! Over the holidays, the Davie Professional Firefighters Association (L-2315) donated \$2,000 to the Our Church, Davie Community Worship Center (DCWC) food pantry. This organization officially opened its pantry in October 2015. Mayor Judy Paul and I attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony. In addition, the Davie Fire Rescue Benevolent Association held the Santa's Enchanted Fire Station event in December 2015. The proceeds and toys collected were donated to a local nonprofit organization, the EASE Foundation. I want to thank the Davie Firefighters for going above and beyond their call of duty.

In 2014, the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) funded additional police officers for the Downtown Davie corridor. The officers help to ensure the safety and the well-being of commuters, residents, patrons, and business owners in the Downtown area. At a recent CRA meeting, I suggested that two more police officers be hired for the CRA area.

Are you ready to relay? The Relay for Life of Davie and Cooper City will be held on April 2 and 3, 2016, beginning at 4 p.m. at Cooper City High School, 9401 Stirling Road. Last year, the organization raised over \$40,000 to fight cancer and to raise awareness for this disease that has affected countless individuals.

The Town of Davie is partnering with the Central Broward Water Control District for the 20th Annual Waterway Cleanup & Trash Splash which will be held on April 23, 2016, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. The cleanup will take place along the C-11 Canal between State Road 7 and Flamingo Road. We all play a vital role in ensuring that the waterways in our community are free of debris.

I am happy to announce that the mural at the Pine Island Multipurpose Center has been completed. The mural is a welcome addition to our growing art base in the Town. To get a sense of Davie, Artist Luis Valle met with the Open Space and Recreation Committee who provided input toward the mural design. I am encouraging everyone to stop by and take a look at the mural, which is visible from Pine Island Road.

In a continued effort to promote our local businesses, the Town of Davie Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) will once again be offering the Downtown Davie Business Voucher Program at the Orange Blossom Festival. The voucher program provides free \$5 coupons to participating Downtown Davie businesses. The program has proven successful, resulting in the redemption of 4,358 vouchers from last year's festival. The vouchers redeemed generated over \$48,000 in sales for our downtown businesses. Since the inception of the program 12 years ago, almost 20,000 vouchers have been redeemed, generating approximately \$267,000 in sales. I believe our local businesses are a vital part of Davie's economy and this program is a great way to advertise and highlight these businesses.

Every year, my fellow members and I of the Davie Woman's Club seek to find a way to give back to the youth in our community. As such, we are offering a \$1,000 academic scholarship to a graduating high school student. To qualify for the scholarship, students must be a Davie resident and a high school senior. I want to update the community on two initiatives ongoing in District 4, the sale of surplus property at the Governor Leroy Collins Park and the dedication of conservation easements to the Davie Area Land Trust.

Last year, the Town was approached regarding the surplus of land at the Governor Leroy Collins Park Expansion. Rick Case Automotive Group ("Group") desired to construct and maintain a wetland at this location in order to facilitate further development along Weston Road in Davie. The wetland will be located just west of I-75. The Town held community meetings with neighborhoods that are adjacent to the surplus property to solicit feedback and to ensure all concerns were addressed. On December 2, 2015, the Town Council approved a purchase agreement that sold the surplus property above appraised value. This requires the construction of a 13-foot berm with vegetation that will serve as a noise and visual buffer from I-75. The Group will maintain the wetland and berm and dedicate a conservation easement and deed restrictions limiting the property's use to open space in perpetuity.

In 2001, the Town Council approved the open space overlay district to create development opportunities for projects that dedicate a certain amount of land as public open space. Two such projects have been approved recently in District 4, Oak Park and Temple View Estates. To ensure the maintenance of these open spaces, each development is dedicating conservation easements to the Davie Area Land Trust, a nonprofit organization. The Davie Area Land Trust's role is to defend the easement and to ensure the property remains protected from all forms of development. This overlay district is a great way to add open space in areas where recreational opportunities may not be available otherwise.

A Tribute to Fire Chief Joseph J. Montopoli

Joseph J. Montopoli was born on October 11, 1958, in the Bronx, New York, and lived there until 1978 when he moved to Hollywood, Florida, in search of job opportunities. His dream was to be married, have a family, and become a firefighter. He was quickly able to accomplish all three. He married his childhood sweetheart and had five children. On October 28, 1980, he was hired as a professional firefighter with the City of Pembroke Pines Fire Department. This opportunity was the beginning of a long and distinguished career. He immediately started to eagerly prepare and to train for any promotional advancement that was presented. With the will and the unrelenting determination not only to succeed but also be the very best at every position sought, he competently climbed the ranks, earning great respect and admiration from his colleagues.

Continuing education was an important value to Chief Montopoli, and as such he went on to earn several college degrees. With vehemence for teaching, he also became a lead fire instructor. Providing professional guidance and mentorship to others in the fire service was his top priority, and he used his vast experience and skill set to positively influence many young men and women who shared the same goals and aspirations as he did. In keeping with his motivation and dedication to progress and for overall betterment of the fire service, he went on to become the president of his local union and effectively represented a diverse labor force for 10 years with passion and integrity.

After completing a successful 25-year career in Pembroke Pines, Chief Montopoli was hired with the Town of Davie during a time when the Fire Department was transitioning under new leadership. The decision to bring his vision and his system of professional values helped to advance the Davie Fire Rescue Department into a new era of progress and tradition. He believed that providing strong mentorship, old school values, and the resources needed to get the job done right was the ultimate key to success. His unmatched work ethic coupled with many years of practical application proved to be a formula of success as the Davie Fire Rescue Department continued to grow and to develop.

From the time that he was promoted to Fire Chief in 2007 until his untimely departure in 2016, Chief Montopoli helped to transform the Davie Fire Rescue Department into the premier public safety organization that it is today. As a direct result of his dedication and loyalty to the fire service and to the Town of Davie, our Fire Rescue Department is now second to none, standing out above the rest. Chief Montopoli leaves behind a legacy of profound leadership rich in tradition that will continue on in the spirit of all those who so proudly served under him and will no doubt remain an influence for generations of firefighters to come.







Planning and Zoning Board



Some of the hardest jobs in Davie are done by volunteers. The Planning and Zoning Board is responsible for providing recommendations to Town Council on all proposed amendments to the Town's comprehensive plan, the land development regulations, and all special requests concerning the use of land, such as setback and height variances, zoning changes, and special permits. Whenever you see a yellow sign on a property announcing a public hearing, the Planning and Zoning Board is usually the first public venue to consider these proposals. All the meetings are held in the evening to make it easier for the public to participate.

Over the past 12 months, the Planning and Zoning Board reviewed 21 variances, 13 zoning code and map amendments, 9 special permits, and 4 comprehensive plan amendments. Very few of these items can be considered routine. Land ownership is often referred to as a "bundle of rights" - and it can be quite challenging to weigh an individual landowner's rights

against those of neighboring owners and the community in general. Each appointed member brings to the table his or her personal experience as a resident as well as his or her individual professional skills. The board conducts a public hearing on each item and ensures that all the issues are thoroughly explored before any recommendation is made.


