



## Tree Legacy Program

In conjunction with the concept of Open Space, the Town of Davie is pleased to announce the Tree Legacy Program. Through this program, residents can become a visible part of Davie's continuing effort to maintain our unique community which focuses on preserving our natural environment.

By purchasing a tree to plant in one of our park sites, you, as a resident of the Town of Davie, can plant a living monument that will grow with future generations.

Once a tree has been purchased, a *Certificate of Acknowledgement* will be printed by the Town for the recipient. If more than one certificate is preferred, please indicate this at the time of purchase. You will have the ability to personalize your message, so please come prepared with up to four lines of text.



**Q. Who can participate?**

A. Any individual, club, organization, or civic group may purchase a tree.

**Q. Where can I plant my tree?**

A. For the first phase of the program, trees will be planted at the Bamford Sports Complex, located near the Pine Island Multipurpose Center, 3801 South Pine Island Road.

**Q. Who will maintain my tree?**

A. The Town of Davie will maintain your tree. However, if the tree is lost through an *Act of Nature*, the resident is responsible for the replacement.

**Q. What types of trees can I plant?**

A. Royal Poinciana, Live Oak, Gumbo Limbo, Queen Crape Myrtle, Tabebuia, and Wild Tamarind.

**Q. Why can I only plant trees in the designated location?**

A. To ensure proper care, your tree must be planted in an area already maintained by the Town. If the tree is damaged through improper maintenance, or poor growth, the Town will be responsible for the replacement.

**Q. How much will my tree cost?**

A. The prices vary between \$175 and \$275 depending on the type of tree.

**Q. What kind of plaque should I buy?**

A. Every tree must be accompanied by a plaque. All plaques must be 8" x 10" and done in either bronze or plastic. Plaques will not be inserted until the tree has been planted.
