





In the Meantime, What Can You Do?

Tip any standing water

Toss anything that holds water

Treat standing water with larvicide

Helpful tip!

Before the rainy season starts, talk to your HOA and encourage the placement of traps in your community's public spaces.



PROTECT YOURSELF from MOSQUITO BITES

Mosquitoes spread Zika and other viruses.



Daytime is the most dangerous

Mosquitoes that spread Zika are aggressive daytime biters. They can also bite at night.



Use insect repellent It works!

Look for the following active ingredients:

- DEET • PICARIDIN • IR3535
- OIL of LEMON EUCALYPTUS
- PARA-MENTHANE-DIOL



Wear protective clothes

Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants or use insect repellent. For extra protection, treat clothing with permethrin.



Mosquito-proof your home

Use screens on windows and doors. Use air conditioning when available. Keep mosquitoes from laying eggs near standing water.
